



THE CITY OF ST. JOHNS GREEN WASTE DUMP

For several years now, the City has operated a green waste facility to assist in making our town more beautiful. The facility has been operated free of charge, and available virtually anytime. Unfortunately, due to recent illegal dumping at the green waste facility, the City has been forced to implement more stringent controls. It is important for citizens to understand that the City is not licensed to accept any-

thing other than green waste at this facility (branches, leaves, grass, clippings, etc.). Landfills are highly regulated by various state and federal agencies, and the City could potentially face large fines for receiving waste that it is not licensed to receive. Additionally, the City incurs a direct cost for removing and properly disposing of unapproved items. As a result of repeated instances of illegal dumping, everything from household trash, to bulky items like old tires, furniture, and even large appliances, the City has been forced to take immediate action and gain more control over the situation. We sincerely appreciate those of you that use the

green waste facility responsibly. Unfortunately, the irresponsible acts of a select few have negatively affected all the rest. We ask you to only dump green waste. The City is citing persons that are illegally dumping at the green waste facility. Violation for illegal dumping is \$100 to \$500 fine. The City is enforcing violations.
