The museum has a surprisingly large breadth of artifacts depicting life in Apache County as the Apache, Hopi, Navajo, and Zuni Tribes, and Spanish and Mormon settlers clashed and meshed throughout the history of our communities. These displays include arrowheads, firearms, written histories, diaries, photographs, tools, musical instruments, household items, and dioramas representing the daily lives of our early diverse cultures.


